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| Declaration of a major in Emergency Medical Care (EMC) does not guarantee admission into the EMC Program. Students must formally apply and be admitted into the EMC Program before beginning the professional sequence of courses and/or proceeding into clinical placements. Admission to the EMC Program is competitive. For consideration, students must have: |
| 1. A cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 |
| 2. Completed all the pre-professional courses: CHEM 139 BIOL 291 (C or higher) BIOL 292 (C or higher) EMC 240 & EMC 241 (C or higher) |
| Note: Students holding a current EMT certification receive experiential credit for EMC 240 & EMC 241. |
| The application form and all supporting documentation must be received by the EMC program director by the deadline on January 15. |
